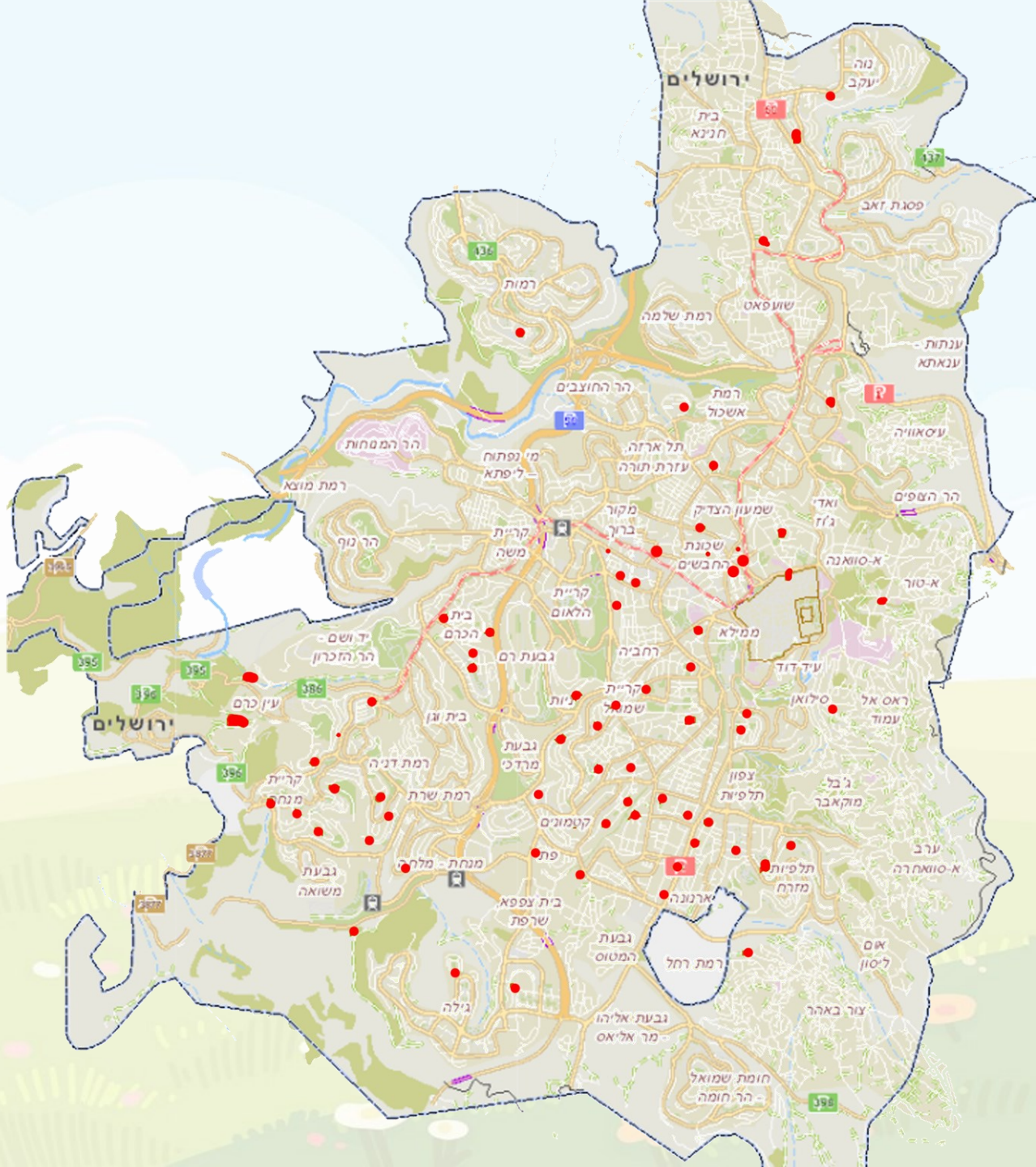


What is a community garden?

Diverse groups of people will come together to create a community garden: adults, children, new immigrants and others. Here are a few examples:

The "Sachbak" (Friendship) Garden – East Talpiot



This is an exceptionally diverse community garden. Its members include immigrants from the Former Soviet Union, South America and native born Sabras. Their diversity expresses itself through the chosen types of plants and gardening styles.



The “Light in Time-hoff” (“Or B’Zmanhoff”) Garden

In an old neighborhood, overcrowded with buildings, a green garden was established which provides a meeting point for an assortment of activities.

Its members include old-time residents, university students and schoolchildren, who together turn the neighborhood into an attractive and vibrant place.



The "Meah She'arim" Garden

A dedicated female ultra-Orthodox resident has managed to harness the energy of her neighborhood, including hundreds of children and their mothers. They daily clean the street, plant shrubs and flowers in the "street furrows," participate in drawing street murals and more!
